In this workshop, selected members of the KNOW-IN research network and affiliated scholars will discuss diverse notions of infrastructures, e.g., humans as infrastructures or the socio-cultural sphere as an infrastructure, and shift attention to influential factors for the creation of infrastructures, such as underlying notions of space and the role of specialized agents. In this context, we will particularly focus on 'infrastructuring,' i.e., the practices that are derived from and/or constitutive of the workings of infrastructures.

###### Dr. Christian Reiss & Dr. Carmen Dextl: Summary of Results – Next Network Events & Plans

How exactly do infrastructures come into being? What role do distinct actors play in the construction, maintenance, and exploitation of infrastructures? How exactly do infrastructures function and enable (or hinder) processes of transfer, translation, and circulation, and finally, how can this be conceptualized and illustrated?

Engaging these questions, we want to outline different forms of infrastructuring in the context of this research network and discuss definitions, notions, and conceptualizations of infrastructures at the heart of our individual case studies. Given the thematic and temporal spectrum of these presentations, we particularly want to find connections to deepen our shared understanding of infrastructural knowledge production, and seek solutions to productively work with the tensions and challenges which might arise from this for our further academic collaborations, i.e., our planned publication, conference participation, and co-taught courses.
